

Poster Presentation Guidelines

- Your poster must correspond to the title and content of the abstract you have submitted.
- Print your poster in A1 size (594 \times 841 mm or 23.4 \times 33.1 in).
- Plan your poster design and layout creatively to ensure a logical flow of information.
- Ensure your poster is legible from a reading distance of 1 to 2 metres.
- Keep your text to a minimum. Your emphasis should be on graphics, charts, tables, graphs, and photographs.
- Avoid overcrowding figures and cramming too many numbers into tables. Legends and titles should accompany all figures, tables, photographs, etc. in order to allow their immediate identification.
- At the allocated time in the programme for Poster Presentation, you are to stand by your poster and be ready to answer questions from participants who visit your poster.
- Authors are responsible for mounting their posters before the session starts and removing them as soon as the session ends. Posters left up past that time will be discarded.
- Authors may wish to bring extra copies of their data and conclusions. Authors may also wish
 to provide sign-up sheets for attendees who may wish additional information, reprints, etc.

Notes:

- 1. Working language for NIE GSC 2022 is English.
- 2. Presenters should be current postgraduate students. Faculty members are not allowed to present.
