## **Submission Guidelines for Oral Presentation**

The submission for oral presentation should observe the following word limits:

Title: 15 words
Abstract: 300 words\*

The abstract should include (but is not limited to) the following content:

- · Brief mention of key literature and research gaps.
- Your research question(s) or reason(s) for the topic being addressed.
- Brief mention of key findings/discussions/arguments.

\*The maximum word count of 300 words does **NOT** include the title, author's name, and name of school.

Please send the abstract through this form.

More details about the oral presentations will be provided after the submission of applications.



### **Submission Guidelines for Poster Presentation**

The submission for poster presentation should observe the following word limits:

Title: **15 words**Abstract: **300 words**\*

The abstract should include (but is not limited to) the following content:

- Brief mention of key literature and research gaps.
- Your research question(s) or reason(s) for the topic being addressed.
- Brief mention of key findings/discussions/arguments.

\*The maximum word count of 300 words does **NOT** include the title, author's name, and name of school.

Please send the abstract through this form.

#### **Poster Presentation Guidelines**

- Your poster must correspond to the title and content of the abstract you have submitted.
- Print your poster in A1 size (594 x 841 mm or 23.4 x 33.1 in).
- Plan your poster design and layout creatively to ensure a logical flow of information.
- Ensure your poster is legible from a reading distance of 1 to 2 metres.
- Keep your text to a minimum. Your emphasis should be on graphics, charts, tables, graphs, and photographs.
- Avoid overcrowding figures and cramming too many numbers into tables.
   Legends and titles should accompany all figures, tables, photographs, etc., in order to allow their immediate identification.
- At the allocated time in the programme for Poster Presentation, you are to stand by your poster and be ready to answer questions from participants who visit your poster.
- Authors are responsible for mounting their posters before the session starts and removing them as soon as the session ends. Posters left up past that time will be discarded.
- Authors may wish to bring extra copies of their data and conclusions.
   Authors may also wish to provide sign-up sheets for attendees who may wish additional information, reprints, etc.

# **Submission Guidelines for Three Minute Thesis (3MT)**

The submission for 3MT should observe the following word limits:

Title: **15 words**Abstract: **300 words**\*

The abstract should include (but is not limited to) the following content:

- Brief mention of key literature and research gaps.
- Your research question(s) or reason(s) for the topic being addressed.
- Brief mention of key findings/discussions/arguments.

\*The maximum word count of 300 words does **NOT** include the title, author's name, and name of school.

Please send the abstract through this form.

# Three Minute Thesis (3MT) Competition Rules

- A single static PowerPoint slide is permitted. No slide transitions, animations or 'movement' of any description are allowed. The slide is to be presented from the beginning of the oration.
- No additional electronic media (e.g., sound and video files) are permitted.
- No additional props (e.g., costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment) are permitted.
- Presentations are limited to 3 minutes maximum and competitors exceeding 3 minutes are disqualified.
- There will be a timer placed in front of you to help you keep track of your presentation time.
- Presentations are to be spoken word (e.g., no poems, raps or songs).
- Presentations are to commence from the stage.
- Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts their presentation through either movement or speech.
- The decision of the adjudicating panel is final.
